Dear Friends,

Well, we're coming to the end of our Bible reading emphasis. For the last year, we've gone through a lot of the Bible together. I hope you've been able to stay with it. If you have, you've seen much of the Bible up close

and personal. There's nothing like exploring Scripture, and then re-exploring it and reexploring it. The first time through we end up saying, "Oh, so that's where that saying comes from," or, "I had no idea there was so much violence in the Bible," or, "Wow, this is the area where the Holy Spirit is really challenging me." But the second and third times we say, "How did I not notice that the first time I read through this?" and, "This verse is a comforting old friend,"



and, "I still have to do something about what God is telling me in this passage."

In short, reading the Bible isn't something we do for a time and then move onto something else. It's this discipline, this practice that continually helps us discover and re-discover God. So, though we end our year of reading together on October 9, I hope you'll keep looking at Scripture. It's full of wonders, and challenge, and history, and discoveries about God, and ideas about who we're meant to be. It's how we remember what God's done and is doing, and all of that migrates into our lives as we read the Bible every day, or as close to it as we can. It's a privilege to serve Him with you.

Join us on **October 2 for World Communion Sunday**. We will receive the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, celebrating with Christians near and far.






SAVE THE DATE: Saturday, November 5th for the Guild Autumn Bazaar
