Dear Friends,

We talk about the church growing—usually we mean the number of people who attend worship. That's not unimportant; but to be honest, we can't really control it. The Holy Spirit brings people... or doesn't. No matter how hard we work at it, it's the Holy Spirit Who creates openings in people's hearts.



But there's another kind of growth that we have the chance to contribute a bit more to. Don't get me wrong – the Spirit's still in charge here, too. But, we

provide chances for the Spirit to work, and the Spirit, a bit more predictably, does. You could call it discipleship. Or maybe Building Faith, one of our church's guiding principles. It happens as we read the Bible. As we pray regularly in ways that are wholistic (including adoration, confession, thanksgiving, and placing ourselves under God's control). As we talk about our common faith with other folks in small groups. As we internalize what happens in worship.

All this is what we mean when we say discipleship. We Christians are disciples of Jesus, no less than Peter, James and John. We are trying to become "Jesus-y." Being a disciple takes discipline. The word "discipline" comes from a Latin word that means instruction and training. If you go a little farther back in its evolution, it means "to learn." So a disciple is a person that allows him/herself chances to learn, discover, and train her/himself around what it means to be Christlike.

When we make those opportunities for ourselves, the Holy Spirit pretty regularly helps us to grow. And, when our church makes opportunities for us to grow, we tend to as well. As a matter of fact, this is one of the things that the Bible calls churches to do – provide chances for people to grow deeper in their faith. This fall, our church will be offering a number of chances to become more Jesus-y. I hope you'll use these disciplines so that you can become even more a disciple of Christ. It's a privilege to serve Him with you.

- We begin our fall Discipleship Campaign (see more details later in The Courier);
- A seven-week small group program begins;
- Sunday School starts;
- We're having our yearly barbecue (we changed it to fall this year);
- We'll be worshipping outside;
- We're working with the Ramsey Wind Symphony (who uses Founders' Hall each Wednesday evening), and are hoping they can provide some music that day;
- It's one of our semi-annual Bring a Friend Sundays (see more in this edition of The Courier).

Please put that day on your calendar. It's a really important day.

The Beatles Are Coming... to Our Discipleship Campaign

Aaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaaah! (That was supposed to be the sound of tens of thousands of people screaming whenever the Beatles played.) The Beatles are coming to the Community Church in Harrington Park. Sort of. In a way. We begin our discipleship campaign on Sunday, September 17. Each Sunday, we'll be using a Beatles' song to drive home the theme for the day. The campaign will go through October 29, with a commitment day on November 5.

Ok, though we're going to be using Beatles songs, the campaign is really centered around an introduction to the Gospels. Most of us know some of the contents of the Gospels, but not many of us know some of the themes that run through each individual Gospel. For example, Luke lifts up the roles of women, outsiders and the poor. John emphasizes the idea of truth and real life. So, we'll be exploring those in worship for seven weeks, and then in small groups that will meet each week of the campaign.

Understanding the themes of each of the Gospels is huge in understanding Jesus – it gives us an additional window into our overall picture of the Christ. We hope this will be a big help to you as you grow in your faith.

Small Groups Starting Again

It's been a long time since we've done small groups. COVID obviously put a big break in our being able to meet in person. Then it took us awhile to get them rolling again. But rolling they are, starting Sunday, September 17.

Our small groups are being done in coordination with our discipleship campaign for the seven weeks from September 17 through October 29. The discipleship campaign will be exploring the themes of each individual Gospel. We will be using really excellent videos from The Bible Project that provide summaries of the main ideas of each Gospel.

There are three opportunities each week to attend a small group: Sunday morning after worship (grab a cup of coffee and then adjourn to the Chapel {except for the first Sunday, where we hope you'll grab a burger and then go to the small group}), Wednesday nights by zoom at 7:15, and Thursday mornings at 10 AM in person in the Chapel.

Please be a part of this seven-week time of small groups. There's no better way to grow in your faith than to talk through issues of faith with other friends and Christians.

Our Church's 125th Anniversary Have

Ok, we may not miss those days, but we do think that outdoor worship may be a little more accessible for folks who may not have attended worship in awhile (or maybe ever). Walking into a church might be a little intimidating, but outside is probably less so.

We're working to have the Ramsey Wind Symphony be part of our service that day. That will be great. This will be the start of our discipleship campaign. On each Sunday in the seven weeks of our discipleship campaign we'll be weaving a Beatles song into our worship. And then, right after worship, we'll be moving to a barbecue right after worship is done – eating, of course, is one of the most fun things Christians do.

We believe that bringing people to worship may be the best way to get people thinking about Jesus. The Holy Spirit seems to often act on folks who come to worship for the first time in awhile, especially if the Spirit has been preparing them. And, to be honest, in the kind of secular culture of the Northeast, this seems to be the least threatening way to get folks to think about Jesus. So please think about who the Holy Spirit
