Dear Friends,

It's worth thinking about the people brought together in the two different birth/early life stories we think about at Christmas. In Luke's story, we have angels coming to a bunch of shepherds out in the pasture lands. Shepherds were working class folks. Shepherding wasn't a glamorous profession, but it was crucial to the economic fabric of Israel.



In Matthew's story, we have Magi coming from the east to see the toddler Jesus. The Magi were readers of the heavens. It seems kind of primitive to us, but they were probably sort of upper middle class, educated folks for their times. They were foreigners.

It's ironic that Luke, who writes more to non-Jewish folk, talks of Jewish shepherds, and Matthew, who writes to Jews, talks about Magi coming from outside Israel. Anyway, there's a mix of folks here, witnessing the birth of Jesus, and then His "toddlerhood." It reminds us of what Paul says to the Galatians: "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

We in the church are supposed to be one. There isn't supposed to be black or white. Neither educated or not-as-much educated. Or upper middle class or working class. Or, especially in our situation, English-speaking and Korean. We're supposed to be together... and we are, right from the very birth of Jesus.

One of the great challenges of the church in our area is to figure out how to be brothers and sisters with our Korean... brothers and sisters. We should be in one congregation with Korean Christians. But, if we can't do that – and admittedly it's hard – how do we cooperate with the Korean church? How do we spend time with them? How do we engage in mission with them? How do we learn from them? How do we take something away from their fervent and passionate belief and following?

This is a really important question. It's hard to work out in practice. But it's really important and one of the challenges that Scripture lays out to modern Christians. It's a privilege to serve Him with you

Sessions will be held on both Sunday mornings after worship at about 11:15, and Wednesday evenings by zoom at 7:15. We learn and grow by being together in small groups. We hope you'll be part of this opportunity.

This is one of a couple days that we put our best face before the community, so that they can see we're the church in the heart of the community, with the community in its heart.

Sunday is also the Musicale. We have sent out a mailing that invites people to both the Musicale and the Nativity. After the Musicale, we'll hold a light lunch in Founders' Hall to make it easy for everyone to stay for the Nativity. Please come to worship dressed casually and warmly, have lunch, and then welcome folks to the festivities. We pray that through these events, we're planting seeds that may lead folks to a deeper relationship with Christ through our church.

Following worship, we had a celebration brunch and program in Founders' Hall led by first vice president of consistory, Barry Wood. During the program we recognized 13 people for having 50 years or more of membership in the church. (See below). We heard memories from Dorothy Nelson and our pastors: Steve, Chuck, George and Mel Van Hattem who has served as our classis supervisor and interim pastor. Many in attendance wrote a memory and we are including one in the Courier each month.



Dear Pastor Steve, Lori, and Congregation,


Our hearts are overflowing with joy from our presence and participation in your 125-year celebration. We praise God for its significance and the privilege of being a part of it.
