

Lynne Lupfer, on receiving the North Jersey's Amazing Teacher of the Month Award. Tom is a drama teacher at Glenfield Middle School and has made a significant impact on his students through his innovative approach to theatre education.

ccomplishments Tom began actively working in educational theatre in 2005 and started his current role at Glenfield in the fall of 2007. Alongside his teaching position, he

co-directs and produces extracurricular theatre programs at Pascack Valley High School in Hillsdale, directing both a play and a musical annually.

Seeing his students succeed is a great source of pride for Lupfer, and he recalled the story of a former student who achieved great professional success as an actor and fight director. Lupfer secured a grant to bring this former student back to Glenfield to teach stage combat and create fight choreography for his production of "Fiddler on the Roof." "It was wonderful watching a former student teach my current students, and a great learning experience for the students involved," Lupfer said.

Coming from a family of educators, Lupfer was profoundly influenced by their commitment to teaching. During his formative years at Tenafly High School, he engaged deeply with advanced choral music and theatre programs, which sparked his passion for the arts.

I recently had gallbladder surgery and experienced the love of our God through all of the folks at CCHP. People called, cooked, followed through with me and most importantly prayed for me and my family and medical personnel. Zach and Mishona reached out to me several times. I thank you all and praise God for all His goodness and peace.
