Dear Community Church family,

I don't know about you but it feels like the first month of the year has gone by in a New York minute. I'm looking forward to my first Lenten season with all of you, and I thought I'd give you an idea of what I and a guest preacher are going to talk about during this Christian season of the year. Most denominations observe Lent, the season which precedes Easter, and generally speaking, it is a somber, reflective time of the year. As we believe that Easter, not Christmas, is the most important day of the year, it is fitting that we lead up to that joyous day with a season that is more somber. I think it's true that you cannot have Easter Sunday without Good Friday.

If you haven't been able to tell, in my weekly preaching I focus on the Bible; I try to base what I say on that collection of texts. But for Lent, I thought I'd discuss some topics which are often taboo in the church, such as death, the dissatisfaction of work and career, illness, and depression. Everyone deals with these topics and parts of life at one point or another, but often the church acts as if a person must have it all together before coming to worship; it might be "taboo" to talk about our fallen humanity at church. Lent, Ash Wednesday, and the season help to remind us that we are dust, and to the dust we will return (Gen 31:9). I am thankful to be your pastor, and my family appreciates you.

Did you know???

That our handbell choir, the Community Church Ringers, is celebrating 45 years in existence?????

In the summer of 1979 the Bell Choir Director, Dorothy Abelman, attended a week-long handbell seminar at Westminster Choir College, with the dream of starting a handbell choir here at the Community Church. That dream continued towards fruition when Valerie Hill donated three octaves of Malmark handbells in memory of her parents, Grace J. and Edward F. Hill. On Saturday, February 9, 1980, a workshop was held for potential ringers to begin to learn how to play. It wasn't too long before they were performing in worship—namely, Palm Sunday, March 30, 1980. Eight ringers played an arrangement of "All Glory, Laud and Honor" with 37 bells. They played again the very next week on Easter Sunday and have played every Easter since (not counting the Covid year).

In May of 2005, they performed a very special anniversary concert, celebrating 25 years. At that time they had grown to 13 ringers with 63 bells and 49 chimes. They also progressed from Level 1 music to Level 3.

We are so thankful for the dedication of all of those, both past and current, who have given their time and talents through the years by ringing handbells. Our worship services are truly blessed with your beautiful music.

Congratulations and thanks to Dorothy Abelman for her vision and her leadership.


